the Explosives Precursors Regulation

The new European Union Regulation on the marketing and use of explosives precursors (2019/1148/EU¹) will enter into force on 1 February 2021.

Several of the products manufactured and marketed by Nitrogénművek Zrt. were already subject to the previous regulation (98/2013/EU). Under this new regulation, the range of products concerned will be expanded.

The incorporation of the regulation into the Hungarian legal system, the elaboration of the detailed rules and the method of practical implementation are still in progress, therefore, with this short summary, we would like to acquaint our partners only with the key basic pillars.

What are explosives precursors?

Controlled explosives precursors

Controlled explosives precursors are products listed in **Annex I** (restricted explosives precursors) or **Annex II** (explosives precursors to be declared) to Regulation No. 2019/1148/EU, which **contain the listed substances on their own or in mixtures**.

Controlled explosives precursors affected in the case of products marketed by Nitrogénművek Zrt.:



Restricted explosives precursors

Restrictive explosives precursors are products listed in Annex I (restricted explosives precursors) to Regulation No. 2019/1148/EU, which contain the listed substances on their own or in mixtures, in an amount higher than the concentration given in column 2 of the table.

Restricted explosives precursors affected in the case of products marketed by Nitrogénművek Zrt.:

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Restriction and reporting

Restricted explosives precursors <u>May NOT BE MADE</u> <u>AVAILABLE to the public</u>,

members of the general public may not import, possess or use them! (Article 5 (1))

In the case of controlled (restricted and to be declared) explosives precursors

- suspicious transactions,
- significant deficiencies, and
- thefts

must be reported within 24 hours.

(Article 9 (4)-(5))

Main obligations of economic operators

INFORMATION (Article 7)

Supply chain

When selling **restricted** explosives precursors all **<u>buyers must be informed</u>**, that

- the product is subject to **restriction**,
- the product **may NOT be made available to the public**,
- the product is subject to **reporting obligations**,

When selling **controlled** explosives precursors:

- the product is subject to **reporting obligations**,

Staff involved in sales

It must be ensured and verified that the staff involved in sales are aware of

- which products contain controlled explosives precursors
- the related obligations

VERIFICATON UPON SALE (Article 8)

When selling restricted explosives precursors

In order to verify that the prospective customer is a professional user or another economic operator, they should request the following information **for each transaction** (but **at least once a year**):

- **name, address** and international **tax identification number** of the **customer** (company) (or any other relevant company registration number)
- proof of the identity of the person authorised to represent the customer
- the customer's commercial, business or professional **activity**
- the **intended** (end) use of the product

REPORTING

(Article 9)

Suspicious transactions, significant deficiencies, and thefts must be reported to the national contact point within 24 hours (the national contact point of the Member State)

It is considered a suspicious transaction if the prospective customer:

- does not appear to be aware of/does not know its intended use or cannot explain it credibly
- intends to purchase a different quantity, composition or concentration than usual for lawful use
- refuses to prove their identity or place of residence or, where applicable, their status as a professional user or economic operator;

- insists on the use of **unusual payment methods**, including large cash payment amounts.
